Return Student First Aid—Asthma Puffers

Many students took first aid devices home at the start of remote learning. We now require all medications and asthma puffers to be labelled and returned to school.

Updating Contact Details

We have noticed during this term that some of the phone numbers and contacts details for families have changed. If you have changed any of your contact details recently please contact the office with your new information.

Health And Safety

A reminder of the processes we are putting in place for student return to school.

- Parents **please remain off site** unless you have a genuine need to attend school.
- When picking your child up after school, please keep social distances and do not stay any longer than you need to.
- Students use hand sanitiser when leaving the room and re-entering after recess and lunchtimes. They are encouraged to use the sanitiser throughout the day.
- **Students must have their own drink bottles.** The bottles can be refilled from the school drinking taps but the students may not use the taps directly to drink from.
- We are attempting to social distance in the classrooms as best we can.
- Staff are social distancing in the staff room and the classrooms.
- Staff temperatures are taken every morning upon arrival at school.
- Cleaning times have been increased. Common touch points (door handles etc.) are cleaned throughout the day. Playgrounds are sprayed with disinfectant after recess and lunch every day. Student tables are cleaned twice a day.
- Students or staff with any symptoms (e.g. coughing, high temperature) are to remain at home.
- All visitors to school must enter via the office and **do not go directly to classrooms.**

It is very important as a community that we do not become complacent now that some of the restrictions are being eased. We certainly do not want to go back to stronger restrictions or even a return to remote learning. We are all responsible to do our bit for the greater good.

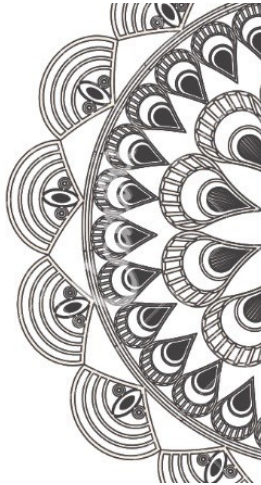
Advertising space in the newsletter for 2020.
